Gather (10 minutes)

Arrival Activity

If some kids arrive earlier than others and you need a lesson-based activity, make copies of an age-appropriate downloadable Activity Page and Coloring Page, and set them out for kids to try.

As kids arrive, clear a safe space and start a game of "Here I Am." One kid will be "It" and can shut eyes or be blindfolded. They will ask, "Where are you?" and the rest of the group will respond, "Here I am!" Specify that no running is allowed for safety. "It" will try to tag other classmates by repeating the question and listening for their voices. Act as a bumper to make sure "It" doesn't bump into anything. Once "It" is tagged, another person takes her or his place.

Circle Time

Invite kids to sit in a circle. For those of you who got to be "It" during the "Here I Am" game, what did it feel like to follow voices blindly? Accept all answers. Is anything in life like this? Listen to kids' ideas. Yes, often in life we have to do what we are told to do without knowing why. Or sometimes we move to a new place or have a new experience without knowing what will happen. That can feel like following blindly. It can be scary, exciting, or anything in between!

Today we're going to hear a touching story about two people who loved each other very much. Though they weren't from the same place, didn't practice the same religion, and weren't even blood relatives, one decided to follow the other. Together they faced the future, through good times and bad.

Opening Prayer

For our opening prayer, I'm going to ask you to snap your fingers as quietly as you can every time I pause. If you haven't mastered snapping yet, just rub your thumb against a finger. Pause after each line of text and snap along with the kids.

Open the Bible (15 minutes)

Naomi and Ruth

Invite kids with NRSV Bibles to each find and sit with a buddy with a Spark Story Bible.

I'd like you to get comfy while I read you the first chapter of the book of Ruth from the Old Testament in the Bible. If shutting your eyes helps you see the story, you are welcome to do that. If anyone wants to follow along in the Spark NRSV Bible Sampler, we start on page 5. Read Ruth 1:1-22 aloud to the kids.

What did you hear that happened in that story? Invite kids to repeat what they remember.

Now please turn to your buddy and read together the Spark Story Bible version of the Naomi and Ruth story. Buddies read the story quietly together. If this doesn't work logistically, ask some older buddies to take turns reading this story aloud for the group. Can you find Squiggles? What emotion do you see on his face?

Discuss the following questions:

If you were Ruth, what do you think you would have done—stayed with Naomi or gone home? Listen to responses. Raise your hand if you've been to another country. Count hands. How did it feel (or how might it feel) to be a foreigner, someone who wasn't from there? Discuss how it might have felt to Naomi moving to Moab, and to Ruth, moving to Judah, especially since the Moabites had been enemies of the Israelites (the citizens of Judah). Why do you think Ruth stayed with Naomi? How do you think this story will turn out?

Bible Memory Verse

"Where you go, I will go; where you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God." Ruth 1:16b

The Bible Memory Verse is found on page 5 of the Spark NRSV Bible. Read it together, then see if you can say it taking turns, like a litany:

Younger buddies can help older buddies put a sticker by the verse in the Spark NRSV Bible.

Where Did You Go, Naomi?

Have you ever gone to the store with an adult, stopped to look at something, and before you knew it, found that your adult had disappeared? It's hard to follow someone when you can't find them. The same thing must have happened to Ruth; she can't find Naomi in the crowd of people! Look at Naomi's image in the picture frame and see if you can locate her on the leaflet.

Activate Faith (15 minutes)

Naomi and Ruth Thaumatrope

Tell me what you think will happen in your future. Encourage kids to be honest, and listen without judgment. Most of us imagine and hope for good things, but the truth is, most people have challenging things that happen in their lives too. We can't always change the circumstances of our lives, but we can decide how we will handle them when they happen.

We're going to make an interesting thing with an interesting name: a thaumatrope [thaw-muh-trope]. It's a very old type of toy that can trick your eyes in a fun way!

Scissors, colored pencils, clear tape, pencils or small wooden dowels (1 per kid)

Directions for creating a thaumatrope:

- Keep buddies paired up so older buddies can assist younger buddies as needed.
- 2. Using colored pencils, fill in the outlines of Naomi, Elimelech, Mahlon, Ruth, Chilion, and Orpah.
- 3. Cut along the dashed lines.
- 4. Fold the picture in half along the line provided.
- 5. Tape a pencil or wooden dowel to the inside of the folded image in the center.
- 6. Fold the image over the pencil or wooden dowel. Tape all loose edges together.
- 7. Rotate the pencil swiftly between closed hands so the two images appear to become one image.

After kids have played with the thaumatrope, invite them to share what they're seeing. Life can change quickly, just like what happens when you spin the thaumatrope. How has your life changed in the last year? Even when our lives change, God promises to always be with us.

Ask for volunteers to read the Did You Know aloud. Invite kids to place a sticker or special marking next to the item they find most interesting.

The Book of Ruth Says . . .

You've all played Simon Says, right? If someone is not familiar with Simon Says, invite an older kid to explain and lead a quick round of the game.

Today, we're going to play a new game called "The Book of Ruth Says..." I'm going to say a line, and if you think it is indeed from the Book of Ruth, then you should act it out however you think that might look. But if you think it wasn't in the book of Ruth, then you should freeze!

For example, I might say, "Ruth and Naomi got on their horses and left." If you remember that line being in the Bible story, you should pretend to get on a horse and ride away! If you don't think that was in the story, stand silently without moving. Get it wrong and take a seat. Let's see who can be the last one standing!

Invite kids to stand up and spread out.

Say the following lines for each turn. Each is followed by "yes" or "no" below to indicate whether it came from the book of Ruth.

Naomi's family left Bethlehem because of a flood. (no)

Elimelech, Naomi's husband, died on a spaceship. (no)

Naomi's sons were named Mahlon and Chilion; they died too. (yes)

Naomi told her daughters-in-law to return to their homes. (yes)

When Orpah went home, Ruth got mad. (no)

When the three women said goodbye, everyone cried. (yes)

Ruth was tricked into staying with Naomi. (no)

It's easy to move to a country full of people who hate your people. (no)

Ruth promised to stay with Naomi forever. (yes)

Closing Conversation

Naomi and Ruth were in a really difficult situation. They were widows, which means their husbands had died. The Bible includes many stories about the importance of caring for widows. Naomi wanted the best for her daughters-inlaw and told them to return home. Show me with your face how you think Naomi felt when Ruth decided to stay. Kids might show faces that are happy, concerned, confused, surprised, and so on. Ruth and Naomi were strong. These two faithful women would figure out the future together.

TALK ABOUT IT

Family Conversations

What are in-laws? How does the story of Naomi and Ruth highlight this important relationship?

How can you show God's love to your family?

What is the longest trip you've ever taken? How did you get there? Talk about how our journeys today are similar to and different from journeys people took in Bible times.

Talk about the relationship between some women in your life and their mothers-in-law Do you see them sharing a close bond like the bond between Naomi and Ruth?

Eye Spark

When you gather for a meal with your family, watch how they love and care for each other, and think of the love Ruth had for Naomi.

Ear Spark

When you hear someone tell you "follow me," think about how you can honor God by obeying God's command to follow and honor

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LIVE IT

For families to do together

Create a poster with different ways that family members can show God's love to each other. The tasks may be simple, such as "Give someone a hug if they are feeling sad." They could take more time, such as "Help clean up around the house." Hang the poster up somewhere in your house where you will see it often. Pick a new task to try each day.

For younger kids

Show God's love to people who might not have family or a home to call their own. Gather up gently-used clothing items from around your house and donate them to a homeless shelter.

For older kids

Go online and research marriage customs in other countries. Are there countries today where a woman is separated from her own family after she gets married in the same way that Ruth and Orpah were in Bible times?




