Rebekah and Isaac

FAMILY

GENESIS 24

What's happening in this story?

Abraham sends a servant to his homeland to find a wife for his son Isaac. Once the servant arrives, he waits for a woman to offer him and his camels water: a sign that she is the woman God wants Isaac to marry. When Rebekah does this, the servant asks Rebekah who she is. Rebekah turns out to be related to Abraham. This is important because it emphasizes God's covenant promise to Abraham that he would have many descendants. After the servant asks Rebekah's family for her hand, he and Rebekah return to Isaac.

What does this story mean for kids?

This story emphasizes the importance of trust and family relationships. Kids will hear about three different people who trusted God: Abraham, his servant, and Rebekah. Kids can think about times their family has been strengthened by trusting God. Looking at the church as a family of people trying to trust in God's activity can help kids see their church as a community that can support them through their own challenges.

Why this theme?

The idea of family is fundamental in God's story. We are God's people—part of God's family. God's leading the servant to a wife for Isaac ensures the continuation of Abraham's family and the fulfillment of God's covenant with Abraham. The role of family plays a foundational part in the development of God's people.

TEACHING TIP

Many kids worry about being seen as different or an outsider. In this lesson, you can help kids understand why it is so important to welcome everyone into God's family by first helping them understand that everyone has that same fear of being rejected.

WELCOME 15

Do some kids arrive early? Try this.

Write "Rebekah and Isaac" on a sheet of white paper and set it on a table with markers. Invite kids to brainstorm pairs of things that go together and add them to the sheet (peanut butter and jelly, Bert and Ernie, thunder and lightning, etc.).

Circle up with kids for an opening conversation.


Let's go around the circle and name people in our family. Give each kid a chance to name two or three people in their family. Be sensitive to many different forms that family can take, and welcome all responses. Parents and grandparents, brothers and sisters, and aunts and uncles are all part of our immediate families. What other families are you a part of? (church family, God's family, Abraham's family)

Today we're going to meet some more members of Abraham's family when Abraham's son Isaac marries a woman named Rebekah.

Pray together: Loving God, as we learn about how Rebekah was welcomed into Abraham's family, help us to know how to welcome everyone into God's family. Amen.

Pass out leaflets, crayons, and pencils.

In today's story, Abraham's son Isaac gets married. Who do you know who is married? How did they meet? Give kids time to respond. On your leaflet, Isaac is on one side of the maze and Rebekah is on the other side. Help Isaac get to Rebekah by completing the maze. Who else is going to help along the way? Give kids time to complete the maze. Invite older kids to help younger kids if they get stuck. Who did you pass on your way from Isaac to Rebekah? (Abraham's servant, two camels) I wonder how Abraham's servant and two camels help Isaac meet Rebekah. We'll find out in today's Bible story. Collect their leaflets until Respond.




Gather kids around the screen where you'll watch the video.

The kids encounter a new person in their group who seems like an outsider, and they don't know what to do. Let's watch how they learn to welcome her.

View Episode 4, "Weird Welcome," on the All Kids DVD Sampler.

Ask kids these questions about the video:


- · How does the ball look after Bekah gets it?
- · Why do you think Bekah doesn't talk?
- · How does Mimi help the kids change their minds about Bekah?
- · How do you react when you first meet someone new?
- How does our church welcome visitors in worship or Sunday school?





Open your Whirl Kids Story & Study Bible Samplers.

Have older kids find a younger buddy. Invite them to find "Rebekah and Isaac" on page 4 of the Whirl Kids Story Bible Sampler. Abraham and Sarah waited a long time for the baby God promised they would have, and finally, their son Isaac was born. When Isaac grows up, Abraham decides it's time for Isaac to get married, so Abraham sends his servant on a journey to find a wife for Isaac. The servant knows that God will help him find the right person. Let's read and find out how God shows the servant who Isaac should marry.



Have one buddy in each pair get up onto all fours like a camel. Have the other buddy place the Story Bible Sampler on the first buddy's flat back, like a camel carrying a load. Read the first page of the story while kids follow along. Have buddies switch spots for the second page of the story.



Read Ada and Otto's questions and comments on each page. Then read Genesis 24:12-14 and what Ruby says about that passage on page 5 of the Whirl Kids Study Bible Sampler.

Ask these questions after you read the story:

- Why did the servant pray to God?
- When did the servant realize who Isaac was meant to marry?
- Do you know any twins like Jacob and Esau or Ada and Otto? How are they the same? How are they different?
- What are some ways to pray?
- · Abraham's family is growing! How might your family grow?

Play together!

Write each name from the song "Abraham's Family" on a paper star: Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebekah, Jacob, Rachel, Joseph, Ruth, Jesse, David, Solomon, Joseph, Mary, and Jesus. Mix up the stars and place them on a big table or open space on the floor. **Which members of Abraham's family have we learned about so far?** (Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebekah, Jacob, and Esau) **This is just the beginning! We are all part of Abraham's family!** Play the song "Abraham's Family," track 1 on the Whirl Classroom Song CD Sampler. While the song plays, invite kids to work together to arrange the stars in order of how they're named in the song. Older kids can help younger kids read each name. To make it even more challenging, have kids arrange the names in a family tree.

BIBLE BIT

God communicates with the people in many different ways, including through a woman giving water to camels, dreams, casting lots, a burning bush, and more!

WATCH IT AGAIN

If you watch the video again, have kids count how many characters are in the diorama at the very end of the video. Who might they all be?

OUR CHURCH

Find out all the ways new people join your church (birth, adoption, marriage, visiting, etc.). How could your group help welcome new people?

RESPOND ®

Pass out leaflets, markers, construction paper leaves, and painter's tape.

Unfold and tear off leaflet square.

- 1. Tape a large piece of mural paper, painted brown, to the wall or floor as a large tree trunk.
- 2. What families have we been talking about today? (immediate and extended families, Abraham's family, church family) We are part of all those families, and we are all part of Abraham's family. Now we're going to work together to make a big "Abraham's Family" family tree.
- 3. Help younger kids find an older buddy and vice versa. Invite kids to fold the dark blue triangles back along the black dotted line so only the green leaf is visible. Older buddies can help younger buddies fold.
- 4. On your leaf, write your name in big letters. On two or three other construction paper leaves, write the names of other members of God's family. They can be people in your immediate family, church family, school family, or another group. Share with your buddy the names you are writing down and how you know those people. Older buddies can help younger buddies write names as needed.
- 5. Take turns taping your leaflets and construction paper leaves to the top of the trunk to make a big, leafy family tree.
- 6. Look at how many people we know who are part of God's family! There are many more too! Let's say together, "We are all part of Abraham's family and God's family!"
- 7. Optional: Take a picture of your kids standing around your "Abraham's Family" family tree and post it to your church's social media page.
- 8. Take leaflets down and return them to each kid to take home.

LAUNCH ®

Circle up with kids for a quick review.

Abraham's servant traveled a long way to find a wife for Isaac, and Rebekah traveled a long way to become part of Abraham's family. Abraham's family grew in today's story and continues to grow today. What is your favorite part of being in Abraham's family?


Pass out leaflet panels, markers, and crayons.

We can help Abraham's family grow by inviting people to be part of our church family. The words on our leaflet say "You're invited!" In the space around the words, design an invitation to church that you could share with others. What words and pictures do you use to describe our church?

Send kids out with a blessing.

Circle up with kids. **God blesses all of us. And that means me** (place a hand on your chest). **And that means you** (place your other hand on the shoulder of the kid next to you). Each kid passes the blessing by repeating those words and actions. When the blessing makes it back to you, say, **Go and bless the world**.

Thank kids for coming today. Remind them of the Family Square on the other side of the leaflet.






