
"God, Abraham sent me to find a wife for Isaac," the servant prayed. "Show me who it should be. Have the right woman give water to me. And my camels too!"


Just then, a young woman came to fill her own jar with water. Abraham's servant jumped up. "Please, may I have a drink of water?" he asked.

Rebekah agreed to become engaged to Isaac. Soon they were married!


