MAKE SOMETHING:

1. Cut a square out of brightly colored paper.
2. Cut a line from each corner toward the center of the square, stopping about one inch from the center.
3. Pull every other corner toward the center, curling the paper, not folding.
4. Secure these corners to the center of the paper with a straight pin.
5. Poke the pin through a pencil eraser and fold the end of the pin down.

You have made a pinwheel! Take it outside to see how it moves when the wind blows.

While you're outside, look for other ways you see the wind at work!
